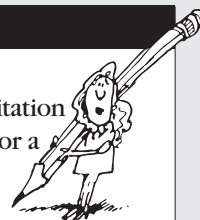

**TAKE NOTE**

If you are a member of a Medicare HMO, understand what skilled nursing and rehabilitation facilities are on the plan's provider list. You or a loved one may live in a continuous care retirement community, but the skilled nursing center at the community is not on the provider's plan. You may have to receive skilled care in a provider's contracted facility outside of your community.



**CAREGIVER TIP**

Some nursing home residents have frail bodies but very alert minds. Other residents may not be able to process numbers to play bingo, but enjoy trips out to a park, or to see holiday decorations. Study the activities schedule to make sure your loved one will have access to the types of activities he or she will enjoy and look forward to each day.

## SENIOR HOUSING TERMS

### Adult Day Services or Day Treatment

Daytime attendance, care, activities and services are a bridge, in some cases, for persons who wish to remain in their own homes but need assistance in personal care and can no longer cook for themselves. Can also provide respite for families and serve as an "outing" for persons seldom able to leave home.

### Adult Foster Home

A residence certified by the Area Agency on Aging that provides accommodations, supervision and personal care services (bathing, grooming, dressing, feeding, medication reminders, etc.) for one or two adults unrelated to the owner of the residence.

### Adult Care Facility (ACF)

ADULT FAMILY HOME (THREE TO FIVE UNRELATED ADULTS)

ADULT GROUP HOME (SIX TO 16 UNRELATED ADULTS)

Licensed by the Ohio Department of Health to provide accommodations and 24-hour supervision for three to 16 adults unrelated to the owner(s), at least three of whom are provided personal care. Typically facilities provide a room, three meals a day and limited (Cont.)

housekeeping, personal care, routine nursing services (meds, special diets, dressings), service coordination and health monitoring.

### Assisted Living

A marketing term used by facilities that may combine apartment-style living with supportive services designed to help older adults live in an independent setting for as long as possible. Facilities may be licensed as Residential Care Facilities by the Ohio Dept. of Health. Assisted living units may include private bedroom, cooking area, bathroom, locked doors and individual temperature controls. Supportive services may include

### Congregate Living

Independent rental housing in which meals are served in a congregate setting and housekeeping, laundry and transportation may be provided, but not supervision of personal care.

### Continuing Care Retirement Communities

Accredited to offer living arrangements from independent to skilled nursing. CCRCs may require the payment of an entrance or endowment fee in exchange for a promise of continuing care to the resident for a prescribed period, usually the life of the resident. CCRCs will arrange for nursing care or provide it on site. Some fees are partially refundable according to pre-arranged published terms.

### Extended Care/Subacute Care Hospital Rooms

Some hospitals offer private rooms on a temporary basis for those who cannot go home, but do not want to move into a continuing care facility.

### Hospice Care

For those who have a terminal illness and require 24-hr care. These programs address the medical, emotional and spiritual needs of both the patient and families.

### Independent Living

Broad term encompassing many types of housing options meaning that a person maintains own living area and attends to personal care needs.

### Intermediate Nursing Care

Persons with chronic disabilities or illness, who require more than the services offered by retirement homes, assisted living or home health may benefit from this option. This service provides 24-hour care for someone who cannot manage to live independently at home. Intermediate care facilities certified by Medicare/Medicaid provide daily activities, social programs, and dining facilities under the supervision of a licensed dietician, as well as housekeeping, linen and laundry service. Some facilities have beauty/barber shops and other amenities.

### Nursing Facilities (Nursing Homes), Skilled Nursing Facility or Health Care Center

A 24-hour nursing care and rehabilitation center that meets federal regulations for Medicare and/or Medicaid. Care is supervised by a nurse under the direction of a physician medical director. Includes dietary, pharmaceutical and social activities services. All licensing/certification reports are available for public inspection. Reports list any deficiencies or corrections needed.

## 10 Warning Signs of Alzheimer's

1. Memory loss. Forgetting recently learned information is one of the most common early signs of dementia.
2. Difficulty performing familiar tasks. People with dementia often find it hard to plan or complete everyday tasks.
3. Problems with language. People with Alzheimer's disease often forget simple words or substitute unusual words, making their speech or writing hard to understand.
4. Disorientation to time and place. People with Alzheimer's disease can become lost in their own neighborhood, forget where they are and how they got there, and not know how to get back home.
5. Poor or decreased judgment. Those with Alzheimer's may show poor judgment, like giving away large sums of money to telemarketers.
6. Problems with abstract thinking. Someone with Alzheimer's disease may have unusual difficulty performing complex mental tasks, like forgetting what numbers are for and how they should be used.
7. Misplacing things. A person with Alzheimer's disease may put things in unusual places: an iron in the freezer or a wristwatch in the sugar bowl.
8. Changes in mood or behavior. Someone may show rapid mood swings – from calm to tears to anger – for no apparent reason.
9. Changes in personality. The personalities of people with dementia can change dramatically. They may become extremely confused, suspicious, fearful or dependent on a family member.
10. Loss of initiative. A person with Alzheimer's disease may become very passive, sitting in front of the TV for hours, sleeping more than usual or not wanting to do usual activities.

## Rehabilitation/Skilled Nursing

This care is often a necessary step between the hospital and home. Your physician will help you decide when your level of recovery is such that you no longer need acute care in a hospital, but continue to need rehabilitation therapy and/or skilled nursing care. Your physician will send comprehensive continuity of care, medication and therapy orders to the nursing facility. Your physician and healthcare team will help you determine goals to help you return home. Additionally, a plan of care will be developed to take care of your needs at home. Your nursing facility discharge planner will help you arrange for home health, Meals on Wheels, and/or other services that may be required.

## Residential Care Facilities (Rest Homes)

Licensed by the Ohio Department of Health to provide accommodations for 17 or more adults unrelated to the housing owner(s), to provide supervision and personal care services (bathing, grooming, dressing, feeding, medication reminders, etc.) for at least three residents and supervision of special diets or medications to at least one resident.

## Respite Care

Short-term stay in a nursing facility to permit the family/caregiver some rest. Sometimes, this time away from home allows the care recipient an opportunity to socialize, participate in mentally stimulating recreational activities and to make new friends.

## Retirement Community

Housing for older adults with organized amenities such as transportation and social activities. On-site meals, banking, health screenings, pharmacy and sundry shopping may be available. All require monthly rental fees with varying lease terms, security deposits and rental agreements. There are profit and not-for-profit facilities.

## Seniors Apartment Building

Some apartments rent only to those over a certain age. In some cases, the units have been equipped with amenities and provide some services to benefit older adults.

## Sub-acute Care

This is a term for care which requires extensive nursing but not direct physician care. Patients do not need the full range of hospital services but do need between four to seven hours of skilled nursing care and/or additional therapy services. Emphasis is on rehabilitation and stays typically do not last beyond a few months. Some examples of common sub-acute cases include brain and spinal cord injuries, infusion therapies, respiratory problems, cancer, stroke, AIDS and head trauma. The necessity to reduce health care costs is why this new level of care is offered through hospitals, nursing homes and rehabilitative facilities.

## Subsidized Apartments

If persons meet low income qualifications, government programs will pay additional housing costs that exceed 30-35% of income. There may be very long waiting lists in some areas.

## HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

Homeowners age 65+ or with disabilities, who have an annual income under \$27,000, may be eligible for a reduction in their property tax. Application must be made after the 1st Monday in January and not later than the 1st Monday in June. Also applies to owners of house trailers.

## TAKE NOTE

Ohio's **Assisted Living Waiver Program** pays the costs of care in an Assisted Living facility for certain people with Medicaid, allowing the consumer to use his or her resources to cover "room and board" expenses.

The program is open to individuals currently residing in a nursing facility or enrolled on another home and community-based waiver program such as PASSPORT, Choices or Home Care. It is also available to current residents of residential care facilities who have paid privately for at least six months.

Participants must be financially eligible for Medicaid and determined by an Area Agency on Aging to need a "nursing facility level of care," the same requirements as for the PASSPORT program.

Eligible consumers can select from any participating licensed assisted living provider. Those interested in participating in the waiver may call:

## Skilled Nursing Facilities/Nursing Homes

**See also** *Adult Day Care, Home Health and Respite.*

### **Nursing facilities are not necessarily the "last step" for patients.**

If someone requires constant supervision and no one can provide this care, nursing facilities can provide temporary respite and support. There are many assisted living alternatives. A person does not need to move into a nursing facility simply because he or she is having health problems or can't manage to live independently at home. Options depend upon the duration and type of services required as well as the level of care that can be afforded.

Nursing facilities may be owned and operated by a governmental unit such as the county or state, a philanthropic or non-profit organization such as a church or religious organization or a proprietary, for-profit corporation, family or individual. Philanthropic nursing facilities are not necessarily less expensive than proprietary nursing facilities. Many facilities have waiting lists.

Family members may feel frustrated or guilty about not being able to personally care for a parent or other close older adult. Nursing home administrators, religious and health care professionals, and the Long Term Care Ombudsman can provide helpful perspectives.

**If Nursing Home Placement is the Appropriate Option.** . . .to make the transition most effectively, a prospective resident, the family, and physician must be involved in the decision-making process.

### **NURSING HOME DATABASE**

The Federal government keeps a database of the over 17,000 nursing homes in the United States. Information is available on 10 quality indicators, examining such things as the prevalence of physical restraints at a facility and the percentage of residents who have bed sores. Also available is information found during annual inspections, such as deficiencies and complaint investigation.



The information can be accessed by calling 1-800-MEDICARE, or by visiting the government's web site, [www.medicare.gov](http://www.medicare.gov).

- Encourage as much independent decision-making as possible by the prospective resident.
- Move as many personal effects as possible into the room to foster familiarity and comfort.
- Assure the person that a family member is always reachable by phone.

### **FINANCIAL AND LEGAL PRE-PLANNING**

There are many complex financial and legal decisions to be made for nursing home placement, and pre-planning is critical. Annual nursing home costs average \$40,000. Families usually begin paying for nursing home care from savings. Medicare coverage of nursing home care is extremely limited. Most people deplete their savings and rely on government-funded Medicaid to pay for the cost.

### **Requirements for Medicaid Coverage**

- A resident's total gross monthly income from any and all sources must be less than the monthly Medicaid reimbursement amount to the nursing home.
- A resident's countable assets cannot exceed \$2,000.
- A spouse living in the community may keep the couple's home, \$80,760 in assets and \$2,019 monthly income.

Some nursing homes do not provide care for residents who rely on Medicaid. Many that do, have limitations on the number of Medicaid beds they provide and, therefore, have waiting lists.

### **QUESTIONS TO ASK**

- Does the facility provide the skilled services you need?
- Are Medicaid beds available? If not, how long is the waiting period?
- Does the facility have planned group activities such as bingo, pet therapy, outside trips, celebrations, etc.?

- Is the philosophical or religious orientation of the facility compatible with yours?
- What is the number of staff compared to the number of patients?
- What personal items may be retained to provide a satisfactory level of familiarity and comfort?

### TYPES OF LONG TERM CARE FACILITIES

#### Nursing Home, Skilled Nursing Facility or Health Care Center

A 24-hour nursing care and rehabilitation center that meets federal regulations for Medicare and/or Medicaid. Care is supervised by a nurse under the direction of a physician medical director. Includes dietary, pharmaceutical and activities services. All reports are available for public inspection. Reports list any deficiencies or corrections needed.

#### Certified Nursing Facility

Meets federal laws and regulations for Medicare and/or Medicaid (skilled nursing). All certification reports must be available for public inspection. Reports will list any deficiencies or corrections needed.

#### Sub-acute Care

Is when a patient requires extensive nursing but not direct physician care. Patients do not need the full range of hospital services but do need between four to

seven hours of skilled nursing care and/or additional therapy services. Emphasis is on rehabilitation and stays typically do not last beyond a few months.

### MEDICARE COVERAGE

Medicare reimbursement is never guaranteed. Services listed are usually covered by Medicare. Members of Medicare HMOs must follow the plan's rules and use its providers and nursing homes only.

Applicable only in Medicare certified nursing facilities. Pays for the first 20 days and \$128 per day for days 21–100 per benefit period if patient:

- Has been hospitalized for at least three days.
- Needs skilled nursing care for condition treated in hospital.
- Is admitted within 30 days of leaving hospital.
- Has doctor's authorization.
- Pays up to 210 days of hospice care for terminally ill.

**Medicare Helps Pay for:** (Providers must be Medicare certified.)

- Bed in semi-private room (two–four beds per room) and all meals including special diets.
- Necessary nursing services.
- Drugs, medical supplies, appliances and equipment (wheelchairs, crutches and braces).
- Medical social services.
- Doctor's services (if you have Part B coverage).

**Medicare Does Not Help Pay for:**

- Personal comfort or convenience items such as charges for phone, radio or television furnished at patient's request.
- Private duty nursing.
- Extra charges for use of a private room, unless the patient needs it for medical reasons and ordered by a doctor.
- Ambulance transfers for routine medical care or lack of other transportation.

- Doctor's services (unless you have Part B coverage).
- Transport for a patient legally pronounced dead prior to ambulance call.

### MEDICAID COVERAGE

Applicable in Medicaid certified nursing facilities. Pays if local Human Services department decides nursing care is medically necessary and patient meets eligibility requirements.

**Medicaid Will Pay:** (Providers must be Medicaid certified.)

- Semi-private room, meals and special diets if prescribed by doctor.
- Drugs and medical supplies
- Some transport to and from hospital and nursing home.
- Physician ordered "restorative" services such as physical, occupational, hearing and speech therapy and diagnostic evaluation visits.
- Skilled nursing.
- To hold a bed for 14 days for therapeutic visits or hospital stays. During the 15th day, patient must privately pay to hold bed or go back on the Medicaid waiting list.
- Laundry services.

**Medicaid Will Not Pay for:**

- Personal comfort or convenience items, unless medically necessary and ordered by the doctor.
- Private duty nursing.
- Non-essential or experimental services.
- Beauty/barber shop services.
- Rest home care or custodial care.
- Continued stay in a facility if the resident's level of care does not match the facility's certification level (if alternate placement available).
- Dry cleaning.
- Transportation costs to visit families and friends.

## Skilled Nursing Facilities by Area

Requirements vary by facility. Some will offer respite care for as little as one day though many set a three day minimum. Maximum stays also vary from one day to an indefinite stay. All require a very recent physical and physician history. Costs for private pay range from \$125–200 per day, excluding medication and medical supplies.
